

HILL'S FCPA & ANTI-BRIBERY POLICY

Hill's is committed to ethical business practices and to acting with integrity in all aspects of its business. Hill's reputation for integrity is a vital business asset that depends upon the commitment of all Hill's directors, officers and employees everywhere to act in accordance with Hill's parent company's (Colgate's) Code of Conduct and all applicable laws and regulations. Hill's reputation depends not only on its own conduct, but also on the conduct of those with whom it does business. It is Hill's goal to ensure that all of its vendors, including without limitation suppliers, distributors, contractors, consultants, counterparties and agents (referred to hereafter as "Vendors") reflect the same high ethical standards as Hill's and demonstrate a commitment to compliance with all laws governing their activities, including laws prohibiting bribery or corruption. It is therefore required that Hill's Vendors share this commitment to FCPA and anti-bribery compliance as set forth below:

(a) Our Vendors are aware that anti-bribery and anti-corruption laws around the world generally prohibit bribery of governmental officials and among private commercial parties, including the giving or receiving of bribes in connection with conducting business. More specifically, these laws prohibit people and organizations, or those acting on their behalf, from:

- (i) paying or offering to pay money or anything of value, directly or indirectly, to
 (A) a government official to influence that official to secure an improper advantage or obtain or retain business, or (B) any private person or organization to induce any person to improperly perform a function or activity in connection with a business or organization, a person's employment, or a public function; and
- (ii) requesting, agreeing to receive, or accepting a financial or other advantage in exchange for improper performance of a function or activity in connection with a business or organization, a person's employment, or a public function.

(b) Our Vendors have not undertaken and will not undertake any action that would cause them or Hill's to be in violation of any anti-bribery laws, nor have they been accused of conduct that would violate any anti-bribery laws.

(c) Our Vendors understand that it is their responsibility to ensure that their employees and representatives understand and comply with this FCPA and Anti-Bribery Policy.

(d) Our Vendors understand that failure to adhere to this FCPA and Anti-Bribery Policy may cause Hill's to terminate the business relationship.

General Terms

1 Effect of Document and Term

1.1 Non-Binding Nature of Document

- (a) Except in relation to clause 4, this MOU is not a binding agreement and merely constitutes a statement of the mutual intentions of the parties with respect to its contents.
- (b) Each party represents to the other that, except in relation to clause 4:
 - (i) no reliance will be placed on it;
 - (ii) it does not constitute an obligation binding on either side;
 - (iii) it does not contain all matters upon which agreement must be reached in order for a binding agreement to be consummated;
 - (iv) it creates no rights in favour of either party; and
 - (v) for the avoidance of doubt and without limiting the above in any way, this Memorandum of Understanding imposes no commitment on any person to proceed with a formal agreement.

1.2 Contract Term

This MOU will commence on the Effective Date and continue for the Contract Term unless it is terminated prior to the expiry of the Contract Term in accordance with clause 7.

2 Effect of Document and Term

2.1 Payment

- (a) For value received, and in consideration for the mutual promises contained in this MOU and the Sponsorship Benefits, the Sponsor agrees to pay the Sponsorship Fee and the University agrees to accept the Sponsorship Fees by executing this MOU.
- (b) The Agreement will be in force during the Contract Term.

2.2 Form of payment

The Sponsor agrees to pay the Sponsorship Fee by the date or dates specified in the Details into a bank account nominated by the University subject to first receiving an invoice for the Sponsorship Fee.

2.3 GST

If a supply under this MOU is subject to GST and GST has not been accounted for in determining the consideration payable for the supply, the supplying party may recover from the receiving party an amount on account of GST. That amount is:

- (a) equal to the value of the supply calculated in accordance with GST law multiplied by the prevailing GST rate; and
- (b) payable at the same time as the recipient is required to pay for the related supply.

3 Use of the Sponsorship Fees

3.1 Sponsorship Purpose

The University acknowledges the request by the Sponsor and will, so far as practicable during the Contract Term, endeavour to fulfil the Purpose for which the Sponsorship Fees are given, and endeavour to provide the Sponsorship Benefits so far as practicable.

3.2 Acknowledgment

The Sponsor acknowledges that the University has full academic control and management of the study programs in the Faculty of Veterinary Science is at the sole discretion of the University, and will be undertaken in accordance with University rules and procedures.

3.3 Sponsor must not make representations

The Sponsor must not in any way represent that the University endorses or recommends the Sponsor or any of its products or services.

4 Confidentiality

4.1 Public statements

The parties agree not to make any public statement about the existence, or terms of, the Agreement except as required to do so by law or where the party has obtained the prior written consent of the other party to do so. Any use of the University logo and name by the Sponsor requires the prior written consent of the University.

4.2 Use of Confidential Information

Unless a party obtains the prior written approval of the other party to disclose Confidential Information, each party must:

- (a) maintain the secrecy of the other's Confidential Information;
- (b) not use the other's Confidential Information except as required for the performance of this MOU;
- (c) not disclose the other's Confidential Information to any other person other than employees or advisers who need to know it

in order to perform that party's obligations under this MOU ("Representatives"); and

(d) use reasonable endeavours to ensure that its Representatives comply with (a), (b) and (c).

4.3 Required by law

Each party may disclose the other's Confidential Information if required by law but, if possible, it must inform the other party first and use reasonable endeavours to limit the terms of that disclosure as reasonably requested.

4.4 Confidential Information Definition

In this clause 5, 'Confidential Information' means all information or data that is exchanged between the parties for the purposes of this MOU before, on or after the effective date of this MOU relating to the operations, business, research and technology of the disclosing party excluding information which is:

- (a) publicly available or subsequently becomes publicly available other than in a breach of this MOU;
- (b) lawfully known to the other party on a nonconfidential basis before being disclosed by the party that owned the confidential information; or
- (c) rightly acquired from a third party who is not in breach of an agreement to keep such information confidential.

5 Sponsor Trade Marks

5.1 Licence of Sponsor Trade Marks

The Sponsor grants the University a non-exclusive, fee-free, royalty-free licence to use the Sponsor Trade Marks during the Contract Term to provide the Sponsor Benefits.

5.2 Compliance with Directions

The University will comply with the Sponsor's directions in relation to use of the Sponsor Trade Marks.

6 University Facilities

If the University provides equipment or facilities for the use of the Sponsor, or access to information or lands or buildings owned or occupied by the University then the Sponsor must use that equipment, facilities or information subject to any direction of the University, and must observe the University's bylaw, rules and policies, copies of which are downloadable from the University's website: www.finance.usyd.edu.au/purchase_pay_lease/polici es.shtml.

Termination

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7.1 Termination by agreement

This MOU may be terminated at any time by written agreement of the parties.

7.2 Termination for Breach

Either party may terminate this MOU effective immediately by giving notice to the other party if:

- (a) the other party breaches a material provision of this MOU where that breach is not capable of remedy; or
- (b) the other party breaches any provision of this MOU and fails to remedy the breach to the notifying party's reasonable satisfaction within 14 days after receiving notice requiring it to do so.

7.3 Consequences of Termination

- (a) If this MOU is terminated by the University as permitted under this clause 7:
 - the University may retain any portion of the Sponsorship Fee paid prior to the effective date of termination and if any part of the Sponsorship Fee has not been paid by the Sponsor, the Sponsor must pay the University all portions of the Sponsorship Fee owing to the University at termination within 14 days of termination;
 - (ii) both parties will return all property in their possession belonging to the other party, including Confidential Information; and
 - (iii) subject to clause 7.3(b), the University will cease using the Sponsor Trade Marks.
- (b) Despite the termination of this MOU, the Sponsor acknowledges that the University will keep archive copies of all conference papers (in digital and other formats) and agrees that the University may include the Sponsor Trade Marks on all archive copies (including electronic and physical copies that it makes available to those who access the University's archives).

8 General

8.1 Terms and entire agreement

This MOU consists of these General Terms, the Details and any annexures or schedules expressly incorporated and it constitutes the entire agreement of the parties about its subject matter and supersedes all previous agreements, understandings and negotiations on that subject matter.

8.2 Inconsistency

If there is an inconsistency between a provision of the General Terms, any annexures or schedules expressly incorporated and the Details then the firstmentioned terms prevail.

8.3 No representations or warranties

The Sponsor acknowledges that in entering into this MOU it has not relied on any representations or warranties about its subject matter except as expressly provided by this MOU.

8.4 Variation and waiver

A provision of this MOU or a right created under it may not be waived or varied except in writing, signed by the party or parties to be bound. A failure or delay in exercise of a right arising from a breach of this MOU does not constitute a waiver of that right.

8.5 Governing law

This MOU is governed by the law in force in New South Wales. Each party submits to the non-exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of that place.

8.6 No exclusivity

The Sponsor is not acquiring the benefits under this MOU on an exclusive basis and this MOU will not preclude each party engaging in activities similar to or in competition with the Purpose or their subject matter, of from the University seeking additional funds for the Purpose.

8.7 Liability

Subject to applicable laws:

- (a) the University's total liability to the Sponsor for loss or damage of any kind, however caused, due to the University's negligence, breach of contract, breach of any law, in equity, under indemnities or otherwise, arising from or in any way related to this MOU is limited to the amount equivalent to the Sponsorship Fees paid by the Sponsor under this MOU;
- (b) the University is not liable to the Sponsor for consequential or incidental damages (including loss of profits, revenue, goodwill or opportunities) in contract, tort, under any statute or otherwise (including negligence) arising from or in any way related to this MOU; and
- (c) each party's liability under this MOU is reduced to the extent that any damages, liability, loss or costs arises from or is attributable to, any negligent act or omission of the other party or its officers, employees, agents or contractors.

8.8 Requirements for valid notice

Any notice or other formal communication under this MOU must be in writing and signed by the Project Officer of the sender or an authorised representative of them.

8.9 No agency, employment or partnership

Nothing contained or implied in this MOU constitutes the Sponsor becoming the employee, employer, partner, agent or legal representative of the University or any practitioner teacher for any purpose or creates any employment relationship, partnership, agency or trust, and a party has no authority to bind the other party in any way.

8.10 General interpretation

Unless the contrary intention appears, in this MOU:

- (a) references to the singular includes the plural and vice versa;
- (b) references to person or individuals include a firm, a body corporate, a partnership, a joint venture, an unincorporated body or association, or any government agency;
- (c) the words "include", "including" are not used as, nor are they to be interpreted as, words of limitation; and
- (d) headings are for convenience only and do not affect interpretation.

8.11 Counterparts

This MOU may consist of a number of copies each signed by one or more parties to the Agreement. If so, the signed copies are treated as making up the one document.

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

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

If the University provides equipment or facilities for the use of the Sponsor, or access to information or lands or buildings owned or occupied by the University then the Sponsor must use that equipment, facilities or information subject to any direction of the University, and must observe the University's bylaw, rules and policies, copies of which are downloadable from the University's website: www.finance.usyd.edu.au/purchase_pay_lease/polici es.shtml.

7. Termination

7.1 Termination by agreement

This MOU may be terminated at any time by written agreement of the parties.

7.2 Termination for Breach

Either party may terminate this MOU effective immediately by giving notice to the other party if:

- (a) the other party breaches a material provision of this MOU where that breach is not capable of remedy; or
- (b) the other party breaches any provision of this MOU and fails to remedy the breach to the notifying party's reasonable satisfaction within 14 days after receiving notice requiring it to do so.

7.3 Consequences of Termination

- (a) If this MOU is terminated by the University as permitted under this clause 7:
 - the University may retain any portion of the Sponsorship Fee paid prior to the effective date of termination and the Sponsor must pay to the University within 14 days of termination any part of the Sponsorship Fee which has, on a pro-rata basis, accrued up until the effective date of termination but not yet been paid by the Sponsor;
 - (ii) both parties will return all property in their possession belonging to the other party, including Confidential Information; and
 - (iii) subject to clause 7.3(b), the University will cease using the Sponsor Trade Marks.
- (b) Despite the termination of this MOU, the Sponsor acknowledges that the University will keep archive copies of all conference papers (in digital and other formats) and agrees that the University may include the Sponsor Trade Marks on all archive copies (including electronic and physical copies that it makes available to those who access the University's archives).

8 General

8.1 Terms and entire agreement

This MOU consists of these General Terms, the Details and any annexures or schedules expressly incorporated and it constitutes the entire agreement of the parties about its subject matter and supersedes all previous agreements, understandings and negotiations on that subject matter.

8.2 Inconsistency

If there is an inconsistency between a provision of the General Terms, any annexures or schedules expressly incorporated and the Details then the firstmentioned terms prevail.

8.3 No representations or warranties

The Sponsor acknowledges that in entering into this MOU it has not relied on any representations or warranties about its subject matter except as expressly provided by this MOU.

8.4 Variation and waiver

A provision of this MOU or a right created under it may not be waived or varied except in writing, signed by the party or parties to be bound. A failure or delay in exercise of a right arising from a breach of this MOU does not constitute a waiver of that right.

8.5 Governing law

This MOU is governed by the law in force in New South Wales. Each party submits to the non-exclusive jurisdiction of the courts of that place.

8.6 No exclusivity

The Sponsor is not acquiring the benefits under this MOU on an exclusive basis and this MOU will not preclude each party engaging in activities similar to or in competition with the Purpose or their subject matter, of from the University seeking additional funds for the Purpose.

8.7 Liability

Subject to applicable laws:

- (a) each party's total liability to the other party for loss or damage of any kind, however caused, due to that party's negligence, breach of contract, breach of any law, in equity, under indemnities or otherwise, arising from or in any way related to this MOU is limited to the amount equivalent to the Sponsorship Fees paid by the Sponsor under this MOU;
- (b) neither party is liable to the other party for consequential or incidental damages (including loss of profits, revenue, goodwill or opportunities) in contract, tort, under any statute or otherwise (including negligence) arising from or in any way related to this MOU; and
- (c) each party's liability under this MOU is reduced to the extent that any damages, liability, loss or costs arises from or is attributable to, any negligent act or omission of the other party or its officers, employees, agents or contractors.

8.8 Requirements for valid notice

Any notice or other formal communication under this MOU must be in writing and signed by the Project Officer of the sender or an authorised representative of them.

8.9 No agency, employment or partnership

Nothing contained or implied in this MOU constitutes either the Sponsor or the University

becoming the employee, employer, partner, agent or legal representative of the other party or any practitioner teacher for any purpose or creates any employment relationship, partnership, agency or trust, and a party has no authority to bind the other party in any way.

8.10 General interpretation

Unless the contrary intention appears, in this MOU:


- (a) references to the singular includes the plural and vice versa;

This MOU may consist of a number of copies each signed by one or more parties to the MOU. If so, the signed copies are treated as making up the one document.
